

Supplemental Application for International Medicine Rotation or International Research Rotation

Ohio University College of Osteopathic Medicine

Four months prior to the rotation, this form as well as the general application for international experience for OU-COM must be returned. You also must ensure that a Preceptor Information Form (PIF) for International Rotations (PIF) and that Affiliation Agreements are completed.

One month prior to the rotation, you must complete a waiver form, demonstrate completion of necessary immunizations, acquire an International Student ID (forms are available at <http://www.ohiou.edu/studyabroad/forms.html>), acquire additional emergency evacuation insurance if necessary, register with the U.S. embassy in the host country, and provide an emergency in-country contact number and copies of your International Student ID, passport, visa, travel itinerary and U.S. embassy registration to Mary Dailey.

In order to get credit for the rotation, you must complete all requirements listed in “Requirements for International Medicine Rotation or International Research Rotation”.

8. What type of visa do you need to obtain prior to entering the country and when do you intend on getting it?

9. According to CDC recommendations (<http://www.cdc.gov/travel/>), what immunizations must you get prior to arriving in the country and what other measures do you need to take to ensure that you remain in good health during the rotation? When do you plan on getting these immunizations?
